Electrical Safety & Arc Flash: Cunningham presented on Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) that should be rated Category 2 for Electrical Safety and Arc Flash, which is for medium volt applications. That PPE should include: helmets, balaclava, coveralls, and arcrated rain gear.

Category 4 PPE is required for certain elevated energy values, such as one labeled panel at the Rocky Fork location.

Gloves should be Class 2, and it is recommended the leather covers be worn. If the covers are not used, the gloved should be dialectically tested every 6 months.

Meters are rated up to 600 volts, ensure the leads are good.

Insulated tools include screwdrivers, pliers, and shepherd's hooks.

Boots are recommended to be arc rated, and Cunningham reminded the crew that the uniform and safety allowance covers boots.

Keep the area around the panels open and "keep clearance open".

Equipment Safety: The yellow trailer for hauling is cracked, and the lights don't work. Ratermann said to stop using it, and Farnen stated there is budget to replace it. O'Neal requested covers over the generators at the lift stations.

Accidents or Near Misses: There were no accidents or near misses.

Status of Work-In-Progress

- Repaving parking lot is scheduled for 2024.
- The driver's license review is in-progress.
- The 911 WWTO Address Posting Brookfield may need a sign, O'Neal will check.
